Chief Mello stated that he is not a traffic engineer and did not conduct the study but if it is the wish of the committee we could extend an invitation to the state traffic board.

Member Munger moved to send a letter to the state traffic board to ask if an engineer could come down to discuss the speed study, Member Moretti seconded. So voted; 5 ayes, 0 nays.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

A) Low Speed Vehicles to be permitted on Town roads where speed limit is 35 mph or less; review and discussion and/or potential action and/or vote 1) Sample Legislation from North Carolina General Assembly

Member Munger explained why he feels low speed vehicles would benefit the town, including saving parking spaces and aiding in reducing speeding on roads where it is a problem.

Chief Mello stated that it would require a state legislature change, but if the committee would like to push this through to the town council that is an option.

Chairman Tighe suggested inviting a state representative to a meeting to hear their thoughts on taking the idea to the state.

Chairman Tighe moved to continue the item to the next meeting, Member Yentsch seconded. So voted; 5 ayes, 0 nays.
